Message from the President

About a week ago I awakened to many rounds of gunfire around the Island. The shooting began a bit of a distance away, gradually moved closer then seemed to be heading to Fort Foster. Living near the water, sound can often be distorted but this didn't seem to be a single person doing this. Several people seemed to be involved. After a while it all stopped.

I lay in bed waiting to hear sirens screeching-medics and police to the rescue-but that never happened. Slowly I began to realize that Kittery and Fort McCleary were once again commemorating an historic battle. I felt quite foolish- I should have remembered.

Waking up to gunshots was, and is, a sobering experience and as the day went on I began remembering another summer in Maine- long ago when I was a little girl- summer of 1942- the first summer of world war II. We weren't at all certain that we'd be able to drive to the cottage that year but by using the car as infrequently as possible that winter and spring we were able to buy the necessary gas to get there in June and home in September. All driving that summer would be carefully curtailed.

The Beach itself was quite different that year. Where once the residents and resident-deer walked through the yard to the beach there were soldiers driving their jeeps through the yard to spend the days and nights patrolling. They were all wonderful young men and they treated us – the neighborhood children – as they would have treated their own young siblings or in some cases their own small children. They told us that we should be extremely proud and happy to have the *very scary low flying planes* protecting us on the beach. They said that whenever they flew over we should always wave to them. We did that with childish ferocity and were thrilled when the pilot would dip his wings to us. Frequently “mock battles” at sea would wake us in the middle of the night. The adults weren't alarmed, and so, we children took it in stride.

There were neither clambakes nor bonfires that summer nor for the succeeding wartime summers but somehow, somehow, despite the sadness of wartime, life did go on. That's the way it was in one section of the coast of Maine, – “summer of '42”. ~ Ellen O'Toole
